


## Note:1. Observe All Local Plumbing and Building Codes. Installation Instructions

- 1. Place rubber washer (10) onto waste tube (9) and set them under the tub.
- Apply Teflon tape on strainer thread and a bead of silicone sealant under waste strainer (11) and thread into waste tube (9). Wipe off excess sealant.
- 3. Because the back slope angle on tubs vary, we have included2 gaskets for you, select the rubber gasket that more closely matches your tubs angle, discard remaining rubber gasket. Place rubber gasket (3 or 3-1) on elbow portion of the overflow tube, hold to the back of the tub at the overflow opening and screw in cover plate.
- 4. Slip joint nuts (5) and Washers (6) onto overflow tube(4), waste tube (9) and drain tube(8).
- 5. Apply Teflon tape to all three threads on three way tee(7).
- 6. Slip tee onto the waste tube (9), overflow tube(4) and drain tube(8), adjust to desired location and tighten slip joint nuts.


  Depending on the size of your tub it may Waste Strainer (11) be necessary to cut any or both tubes.
- 7. Thread on drain tube (8) and onto the escutcheon(12), make the necessary connection to your drain system.
- 8. Fill tub with water, sufficient to cover the overflow cover plate (2), check for leaks and retighten any connections as necessary.


# INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS Cast Iron Tub with or without Drain

#### Caution


This bathtub is heavy. Get help lifting and moving this tub. Read all instructions thoroughly before starting the installation.

### Important Points to Remember:


- 1. Provide adequate floor support.
- 2. Make sure the subfloor is level. Provide drain access from below. Provide access to all plumbing connections. Observe local building and plumbing codes.




1. Clean, level, and prepare the floor for installation. Place the unit in the exact installed position on the floor and trace the outline of the bath with a pencil or any erasable marking.



 Determine the location of the drain pipe, on the floor by taking measurements of the drain and waste location underneath the unit.
 Note: Drain and waste locations will vary by model.
 Using a blanket, cardboard, or other clean protective surface, turn the unit on its side so that the unit is properly supported during drain installation.





3. Clean the drain hole area in preparation of setting the drain. The area should be dry and free of any debris. Apply a bead of clear silicone or plumbers putty around the Drain Body and pass it through the drain hole. Apply plumbers putty to the Washer and slide it over the bottom of the drain body.




4. Refer to clawfoot tub drain installation recommended by manufacturer.






5. Apply a generous bead of adhesive or silicone to the bottom of the tub supports. Then apply a bead of tub and tile caulk around the edge of the base.




6. Carefully set tub into position and connect the drain hardware (previously installed). Finish the installation of the tailpiece installation.



7. Fill the tub with water to the overflow and then drain the tub while inspecting the waste connections below the floor for leaks. Access from below will be necessary for this step.

## Cleaning

Clean with a damp cloth only. Avoid using metal or abrasive polishes.



8. With the bathtub now in place, wipe off any excess tub and tile caulk and adhesive where the tub meets the floor. Run a bead of tub and tile caulk around the bottom edge of the bathtub where it meets the floor.

Wipe off any excess caulk with a wet cloth.
