

Eye-Team Coloring Rock Game

Test Guide

This activity helps develop ocular movement, hand-eye coordination, and accommodation abilities.

- 1. Position distance colored grid chart at the patient's eye level on a wall. Select the coloring page with color codes on the picture.
- 2. Have the patient sit at a table roughly 10 feet from the distance color grid chart.
- 3. The color codes on the coloring sheet determine what color the area should be colored. Have the patient look at the distance colored grid chart and use eye movements to look across and down to determine the desired color. (Ex. D4; You would go across to the D row and down to the number 4 column, which is the color purple.)
- 4. If the patient does not understand the activity, place the distance colored grid chart next to the coloring sheet and allow them to use their fingers to guide eye-movement.
- 5. Once the activity is understood, place the distance colored grid chart at the desired range then continue coloring activity.
- 6. Compare the patient's pictures to the answer key to confirm results.
- 7. To make the activity easier, position the patient closer to the distance colored grid chart, roughly 5 feet away.
- 8. To accommodative ability, patch one eye, choose a different coloring sheet, and have the patient complete the process again. Then compare the patient's results to the answer key. Repeat for the opposite eye.

*Note: Both distance colored grid and near color codes are 20/40, calibrated for 10 feet & 16 inches, respectively.
