

Fabric & Upholstery Repair Kit

INSTRUCTIONS

Kit contains: fabric fibers, clear dry adhesive, backing fabric, spatula, mixing cups and color mixing guide.

Always make a practice repair on a fabric sample before making an actual repair.

PREPARE THE SURFACE

Clean the damaged area with household cleaner. Trim any loose threads. If padding is missing beneath the damaged area and the area is depressed, spread cotton balls or cotton batting evenly under the damage to build it back up.

MATCH YOUR COLOR

Using the color match guide, place the desired combination of colors into the empty mixing container (with the metal ball) provided. Shake the container 30-45 seconds to blend the fibers. Repeat as necessary until you have achieved your color match.

PERFORM THE REPAIR

FOR LARGER AND DEEP HOLES:

- 1A. Cut the enclosed piece of backing fabric so that it is slightly larger than the damaged area. Insert the fabric into the damage and arrange so that it covers the damaged area from the inside.
- 2A. Using the spatula, apply the fabric adhesive onto the damaged spot. Fill the damage as evenly as possible, covering it entirely. **Rinse the spatula with clean water after completing this step. You will need a clean, dry spatula to continue with step #1B below.** For best results, allow to dry 1 hour before proceeding then continue with step 1B.

FOR SMALL/AVERAGE RIPS AND TEARS:

- 1B. Apply a thin layer of clear dry adhesive to the area to be repaired. **Rinse the spatula with clean water after completing this step. You will need a clean, dry spatula to continue.** Using a clean spatula, scoop up a small amount of mixed fibers, and slowly and **evenly** slide them off onto the adhesive, using your finger or the enclosed screen for sifting. **DO NOT** touch the adhesive with the spatula. Cover the adhesive completely with the fabric fibers.
- 2B. Use the spatula to pack the fibers down into the damage, and to duplicate any patterns in the fabric (example: lines or swirls). Allow several hours to dry before blowing off any excess fibers.

If the repair is not as blended as you would like, repeat step 1B, and immediately apply the fabric fibers. Blow off excess fibers, and allow to dry. Repair dries completely in 24 hours.

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COLOR MIXING GUIDELINE

Always add colors in small amounts (one or two drops)

Clean tools after each use and between color changes

TO ACHIEVE:	START WITH: (enough to fill repair)	ADD: (in small amounts, one or two drops)
Avocado	Yellow	Brown/Black
Beige	White	Brown, Yellow to Brighten
Blue, Navy	Blue	Black/Green
Blue, Powder	White	Blue
Blue, Royal	Blue	Black & A Spot of Green
Blue, Turquoise	Blue	Touch of Green
Blue, Wedgwood	White	Blue & A Spot of Black
Brown, Saddle	Yellow	Red, Black, White
Burgundy	Red	Brown, Black, Yellow
Butterscotch	Yellow	White, Brown, Black
Cherry	Equal White & Red	Touch of Black & Yellow
Chestnut	Yellow	Red, Black, White
Gold	Yellow	Red or Brown
Golden Mustard	Yellow	Red, Black, Touch of Green
Green, Bottle	Yellow	Blue
Green, Emerald	Yellow	Green/White
Green, Forest	Green	Black
Green, Grass	Yellow	Blue and Green
Green, Light	Green	White/Yellow
Green, Lime	Yellow	Blue then Black to deepen
Green, Olive	Green	Yellow
Green, Pine	Green	Yellow/Black
Green, Turquoise	Green	Blue
Grey	White	Touch of Black
Grey, Charcoal	White	Black
Grey, Gunmetal	Black	White/Red
Grey, Pearl	White	Touch of Black
Honey	White	White, Yellow, Brown
Maroon	Red	Black or Brown
Natural	White	Touch of Yellow & Red - 2 Touches Black
Navy, French	Blue	Black/Grey
Nutmeg	Red	Black/Red
Oak, Dark	White	Yellow, Red & Black to Darken
Oak, Light	Equal White & Yellow	Black, Yellow & Red
Off White	White	Brown or Black
Orange	Yellow	Red
Orange, Burnt	White	Orange/Brown
Orange, Mandarin	Yellow	Red/Brown
Pink	Red	White
Plum	Red	White, Blue, Black
Purple, Dark	Red	Blue/Black
Raspberry	Blue	White/Red
Red, Regal	Red	Blue
Red, Tomato	Red	Yellow/Brown
Walnut	White	White, Yellow, Red & Double Black
Yellow, Lemon	Yellow	White, Touch of Green
